Now that ECHS is the first 1:1 School in the County where each Student has a Chromebook Computer, we are pleased to announce that the School System has rolled-out a Policy that allows Students to take their Chromebook Computers home beginning in January 2018. Wireless access extends Teacher contact and homework assignment activity for a low, yearly fee of \$25.

EARLY COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL (ECHS) STEM GARDEN PROJECT

(Folks, that's Science, Technology, Engineering and Math, not fruit handles :)

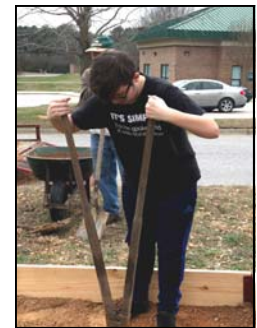
With support from the NC State Extension & Soil Conservation Services, we are creating a Raised-Bed Garden at the ECHS Campus to help Science Teacher Sanjana Sharma engage 9-10 Grade Students to analyze and interpret experimental data.

We are not building a community garden, or one designed to produce pounds of vegetables, or one for ornamental or historical value; rather, a STEM Garden designed to allow Students to observe the outcomes of Earth Science and Biology experiments.

For example, we will subdivide the Raised Beds so properties like soil type, soil pH, fertilizer rates and light levels can be varied, so Students can then assess the impacts upon plant health, growth and yield. By taking measurements and creating data graphs, hypotheses will be tested against the observed results. This approach reinforces Student understanding of how the scientific method can be used to explore our universe and learn about the secrets it holds.

Additionally, hands-on Composting will be taught to reinforce the science and importance of recycling and the renewability of our natural resources. ECHS Students will study the economics of recycling waste from their cafeteria.
